Your college health insurance plan may not cover health care expenses for your pregnancy and birth if:

- You became pregnant before starting your studies
- You became pregnant during a period without health insurance coverage from your college

Check your health insurance policy or speak to the insurance provider for details about pregnancy coverage.

Quick facts about going to a hospital to give birth

- You do not need to present ID to receive care at a hospital. You only need to give your name, gender, and date of birth or age.
- Costs for health care vary from hospital to hospital.
- Some hospitals will present you with a bill upfront, while others provide one after you have received care. If you can, speak with the hospital business office to negotiate paying OHIP rates and to arrange a repayment plan.
- In an emergency, you cannot be refused service at a hospital, even if you don't have a health card.
